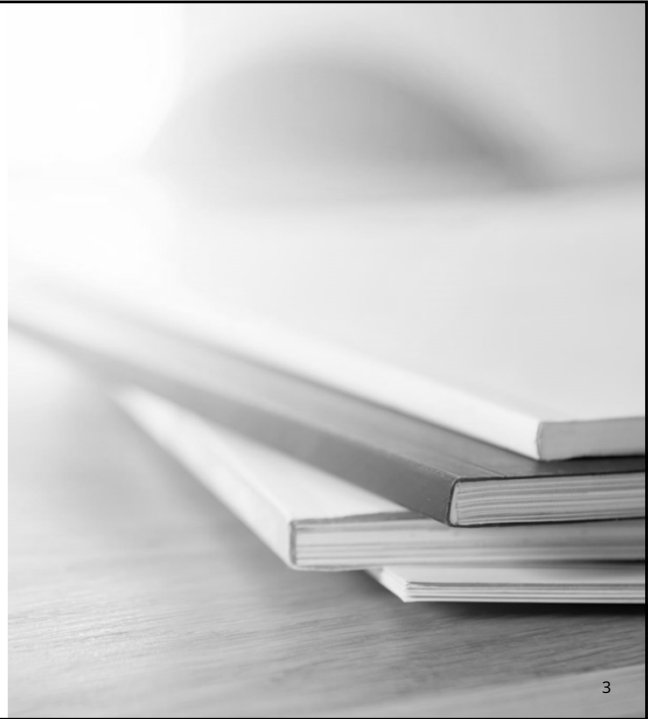

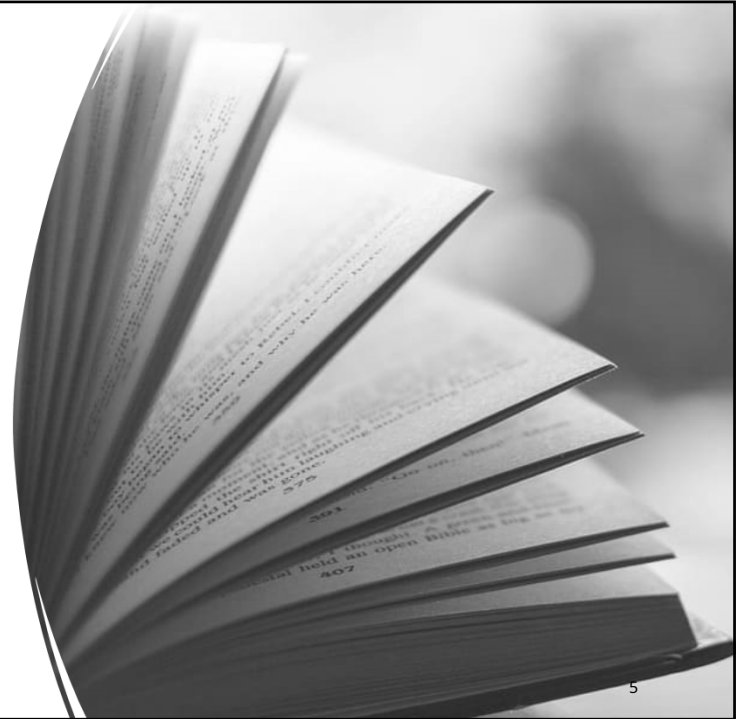


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DNP Project to Publication

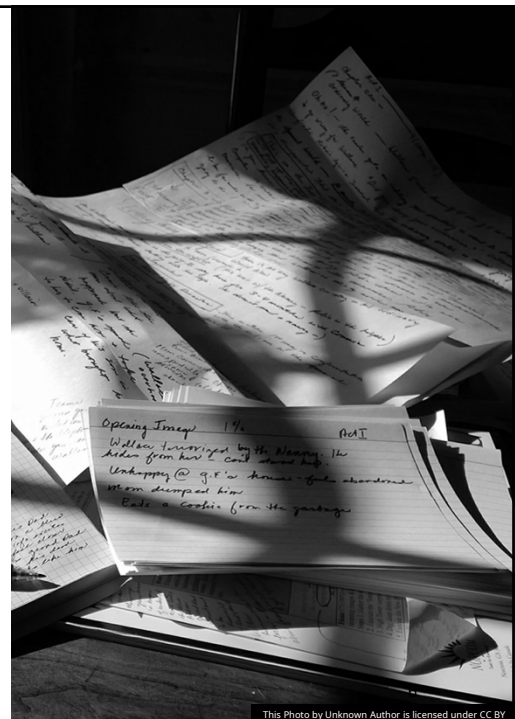
- DNP Project

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Student Paper

- Telemental health paper
 - Colleagues
 - Writing help
- Conferences/Symposiums
- Seek out opportunities
 - Adult vs Peds



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Other Examples

- Student paper for epidemiology/biostatistics course
 - Revised minimally to fit journal guidelines
- Multiple colleagues' experiences with bots in online surveys
 - Each author wrote a paragraph or two about their experience
- Development of a data collection form
 - Description of form development and use with form as table
- Evidence-based parent/caregiver education
 - Findings from review of evidence on tracheostomies and feeding tubes



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Key Takeaways from Other Examples

- You do not need data to present or publish
 - There are many different presentation and publication types that are not data-focused.
- You likely have a paper, literature review or table, handout, process, or form that you have created
 - There is work that you have done that can be updated or described in a presentation or paper.
- You have friends and colleagues that would be interested in working with you
 - There are others like you who would like to present and publish too—divide and conquer.

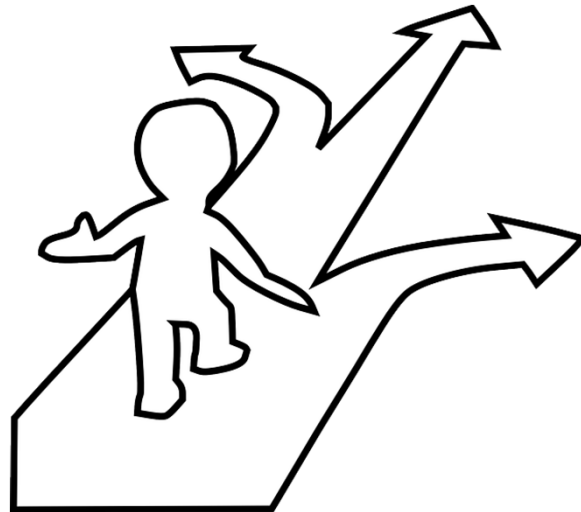


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5 Steps to Publication⁴

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Reporting Guidelines

- Checklist, flow diagram, or structured text
- Minimal info that should be included
 - Methods
 - Results
- Ensures transparency & reproducibility



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SQUIRE Guidelines

Notes to Authors

- The SQUIRE guidelines provide a framework for reporting new knowledge about how to improve healthcare.
- The SQUIRE guidelines are intended for reports that describe system level work to improve the quality, safety, and value of healthcare, and used methods to establish that observed outcomes were due to the intervention(s).
- A range of approaches exists for improving healthcare. SQUIRE may be adapted for reporting any of these.
- Authors should consider every SQUIRE item, but it may be inappropriate or unnecessary to include every SQUIRE element in a particular manuscript.
- The SQUIRE Glossary contains definitions of many of the key words in SQUIRE.
- The Explanation and Elaboration document provides specific examples of well-written SQUIRE items, and an in-depth explanation of each item.
- Please cite SQUIRE when it is used to write a manuscript.
