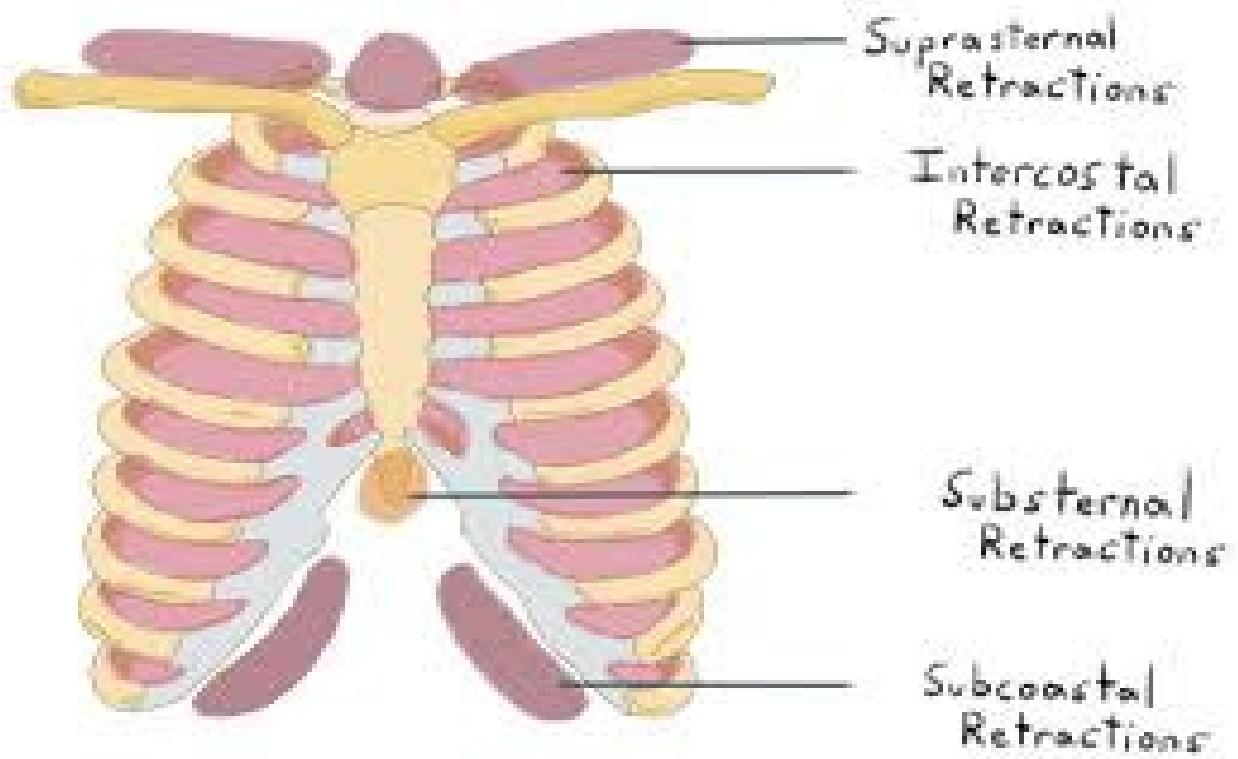
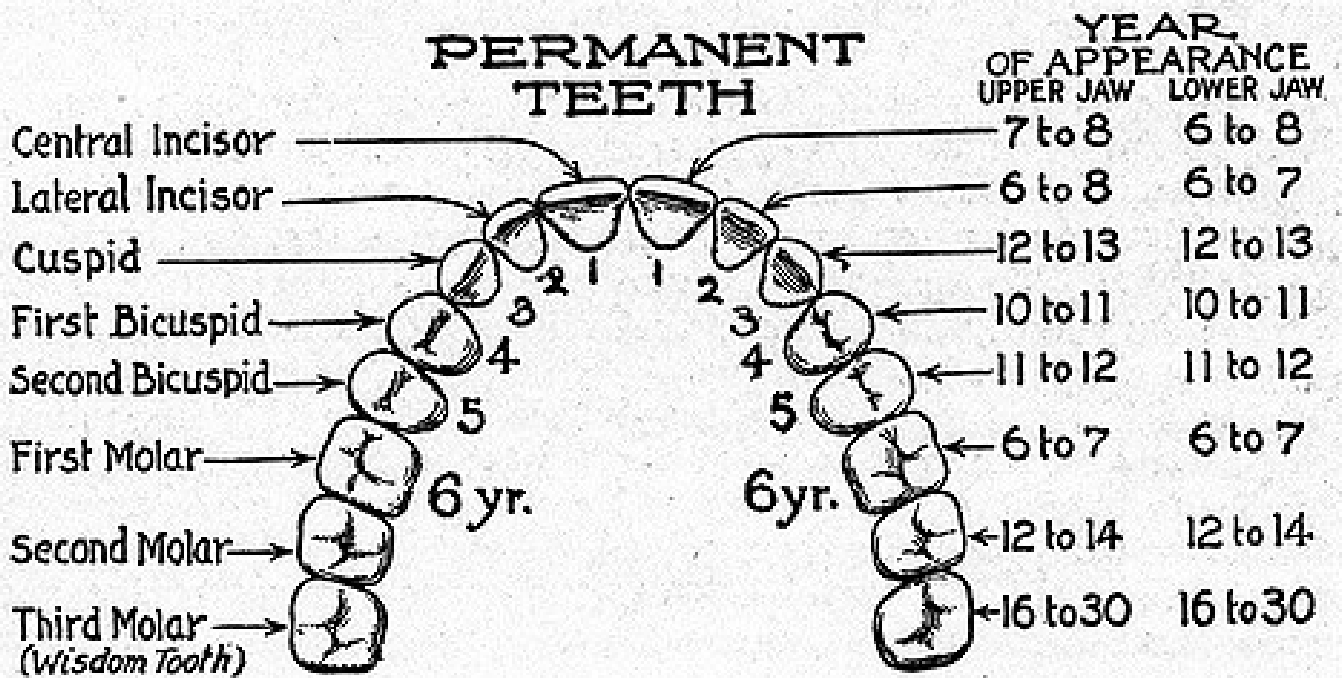
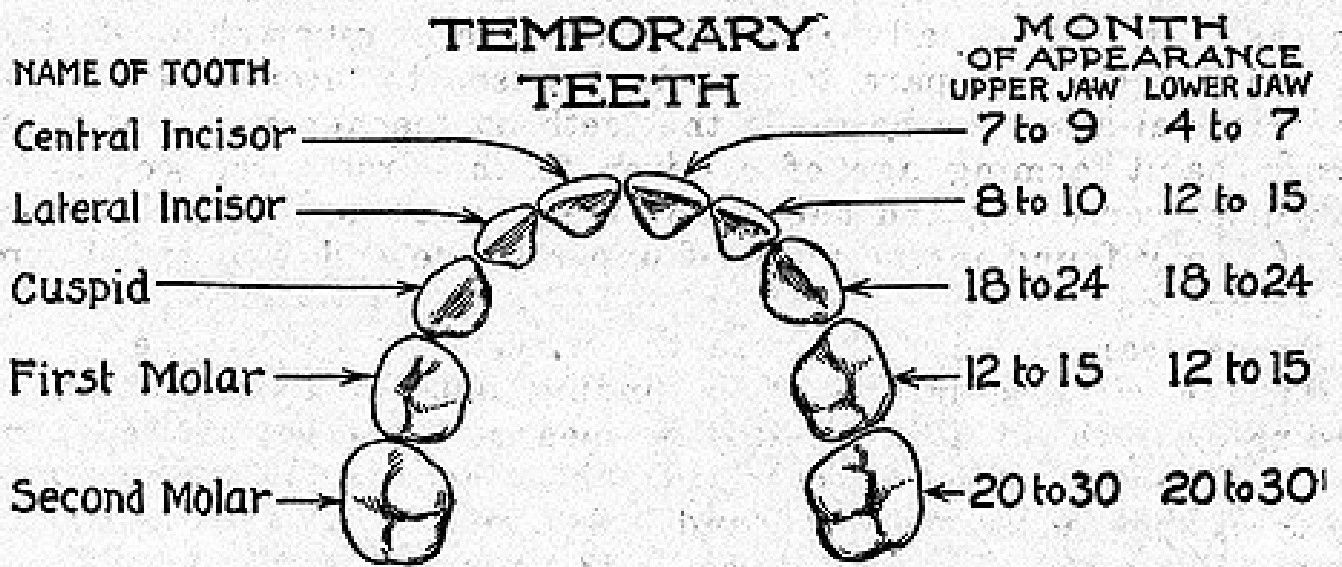

Infants (Birth -1)	<p>2 month Extension, non-directed hand swipes, turns head when prone</p> <p>4 month Direct swiping, ulnar-palmar grasp, Begins to roll, head steady in supported sitting position, no head lag</p> <p>6 month Radial palmar grasp, sits independently rolls over, rocks on hands & knees, free head life in prone position</p> <p>9 month Voluntary release, scissor graphs, sits alone well, may crawl, cruises, pivots while seated pulls to stand</p> <p>12 month Pincer grasp, walks with one hand held, standalone momentarily</p>	<p>0-3 months Attend to voice, turns head/eyes Undifferentiated but strong cry Quests in response to voice Smiles, coos</p> <p>3-6 months Seeks sound source May look in response to name Increase babbling Repetitive babbling Laughs Vocalizes to toys Spontaneous smile to verbal play Experiments with own voice</p> <p>6-9 months Inhibits to “no” Individual words have meaning Babbles tunefully Uses m, n, b, d, t Initiates sounds Uses nonspecific “mama, dada”</p> <p>9-12 month Gives toy upon request Understands simple commands Turns head to name Increasing imitation Jargon increase Imitates sounds</p>	<p>1-3 months Imitating expressions Track objects or faces past midline, vertically, horizontally Begin to enjoy toys</p> <p>4-5 months Engaging and entertaining Follow caregiver 180 degree around their environment Begin to realize that caregivers are responding to their needs</p> <p>6- 8 months Enjoy social play Begin to use gestures such as pointing, reaching, tugging</p> <p>9-12 months Stranger anxiety Look to parents for reassurance Emotions become more evident Begin to help with dressing by extending arms out</p>	<p>Establishing social bonds & attachment</p> <p>Acquire sense of trust & security</p>	<p>Freud (Oral)</p> <p>Erikson (Trust vs Mistrust)</p> <p>Piaget (Sensorimotor)</p>
